


## 2021 Lichtenwalter Vineyard Pinot Noir

## 2021 Dukes Family Vineyards Dijon 777 Pinot Noir

The **Dukes Family Vineyards** are located in the versatile Eola-Amity AVA and they are committed to low impact and sustainable farming methodologies. We love featuring the Dijon 777 from other vineyards, as there is a consistently bright and expressive quality to this special clone. This bottling offers a definitive minerality on the nose, with bright acidity and juicy cane fruit on the palate, a hallmark of the Eola-Amity AVA. This vineyard has rocky soils and cool nights, expressed as beautifully intense tannins and a soft finish.



**Bieze Vineyard** also receives cool nightly breezes that flow through the Van Duzer Corridor, a break in the Coast Range. This exposure reduces temperatures on hot summer afternoons and allows grapes to develop and retain focused acidity. Look for light-toasted aromas. with layers of blueberry and pomegranate on the midpalate for the **2021 Bieze Vineyard Pinot** *Noir.* This is a well-balanced and approachable wine. Like the Lichtenwalter, this bottle will show its vibrancy best when decanted.
